
 Going to Pilate, he asked for Jesus' body. ⁵³ Then he took it down, wrapped it in linen cloth and placed it in a tomb cut in the rock, one in which no one had yet been laid. ⁵⁴ It was Preparation Day, and the Sabbath was about to begin.

• 55 The women who had come with Jesus from Galilee followed Joseph and saw the tomb and how his body was laid in it.

 At the crack of dawn on Sunday, we came to the tomb carrying the burial spices we had prepared. We found the entrance stone rolled back from the tomb, so we walked in. But once inside, we couldn't find the body of the Master Jesus. We were puzzled, wondering what to make of this. Then, out of nowhere it seemed, two men, light cascading over them, stood there. We were awestruck and bowed down in worship.

- The men said, "Why are you looking for the Living One in a cemetery? He is not here, but raised up. Remember how he told you when you were still back in Galilee that he had to be handed over to sinners, be killed on a cross, and in three days rise up?"
- Then we remembered Jesus' words.
