Paul's challenge:

The fundamental leap of imagination that Paul is asking the puzzled Corinthians to make is to a body which cannot and will not decay or die; something permanent, established, not transient or temporary.

So will it be with the resurrection of the dead:

- The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable;
- It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory;

- It is sown a "soul-filled" body, it is raised a "Spirit-filled" body.
